AREA 3: GRAMMAR & TEXT

Course 1: Grammaticalization – synchronic and diachronic perspectives – Gabriele Diewald (Leibniz Universität Hannover, Germany)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Although “grammar” is commonly thought of as being the stable, unchangeable part of language, its skeleton as it were, it is still subject to change. Grammatical categories, grammatical paradigms, and grammatical rules do not remain the same over time, but are constantly modified, innovated, replaced. This transformation does not happen randomly, but follows particular tendencies and regularities. The morphosyntactic, semantic and functional changes involved in the rise of grammatical markers follow general, cross-linguistically valid rules and tendencies, and are subject to generalizable types of restrictions and contexts.

This class is concerned with the theoretical foundation of grammaticalization studies and with detailed cases studies of the diachronic development of grammaticalizing items and the synchronic variation of co-existing constructions with different degrees of grammaticalization in a particular functional domain. Examples will be taken mainly from German.

The course language will be English.

Course 2: Relações discursivas em torno de pontos de vista – Maria Aldina Marques (Universidade do Minho, CEHUM)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

O título escolhido é deliberadamente ambíguo, conjugando sentidos que poderemos chamar de técnicos e não-técnicos. Tal não se limita a um interior e exterior teóricos. Em diferentes correntes, a noção de ponto de vista tem definição e estatuto teórico diversos. Radica aqui um primeiro ponto de vista sobre a necessidade de trabalhar num quadro teórico, que não descarta a possibilidade de um quadro interdisciplinar, com os riscos e possibilidades que acarreta tal posicionamento. Como noção teórica o ponto de vista, PdV ou, ainda PDV, ocupa lugares diversos, mais periféricos ou mais centrais. Advogando a sua centralidade teórica, abordamo-lo nas redes de relações que estabelece com outros conceitos e problemáticas.

O curso organiza-se, assim, segundo diferentes eixos:

- a) necessidade de um quadro teórico para falar de ponto de vista.
- b) abordagem enunciativa dos discursos a partir da noção de ponto de vista.
- c) PDV e responsabilidade enunciativa.
- d) PDV e ethos.
- e) PDV e emoções.

Discursos políticos, mediáticos e humorísticos, entre outros, suportam a construção discursiva.

O curso será lecionado em português.

Course 3: Textos, historia y sociedad(es): cuestiones de alteridad en el análisis de textos y géneros – Florencia Miranda & Diego Bussola ((Universidad Nacional de Rosario, Argentina)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Este seminario propone abordar la relación entre textos, historia y sociedad(es) considerando la problemática de la alteridad en los procesos de análisis de textos y de géneros textuales. Para eso, nos situamos en el marco epistemológico y metodológico del Interaccionismo Sociodiscursivo. Específicamente, tomaremos dos ejes de reflexión. Por un lado, asumiendo la historicidad de los textos y los géneros, observaremos las especificidades en los procesos de estudio y tratamiento

de “textos históricos” (es decir, textos no contemporáneos para el/la investigador/a). Asimismo, proponemos discutir acerca de los procesos históricos vinculados a la configuración y reconfiguración de los géneros textuales. Por otro lado, proponemos observar el análisis de textos y de géneros textuales desde una mirada comparatista, para los casos en los que se trabaja sobre corpora paralelos o corpora comparables. Este tipo de abordaje plantea el problema de la observación comparada no sólo de objetos semióticos, sino también y en función del carácter complejo que les reconocemos a esos objetos, de contextos sociales diferentes. Ambos ejes – el de la historia y el de la(s) sociedad(es) – nos permitirán problematizar los procesos de análisis de textos y de géneros textuales, reconociendo la importancia de la mirada de quien investiga frente a hechos u objetos que no reconoce como propios. Esta mirada sobre lo diferente y lo otro – que llamamos alteridad - nos permitirá, finalmente, discutir sobre la necesidad de asumir una actitud atenta y sin prejuicios en los procesos de estudio.

El seminario será dictado en español o en portugués.
