

INE 2011 (Portuguese Statistics Institute) -> Catholic Religion is still dominant in Portugal with 7 281 887 catholic citizens.

• During 2021, 424 victims have been acknowledged to have suffered sexual abuse over the years by members of the Catholic Church (Observador, 2022).

• In 2020, 2 434 people were sexually abused by members of the common society (INE 2022)

What's our goal? To analyse how this sort of crime is described in the portuguese press, easing or softening the way it is described/perceived according to the social group in which the agressor belongs.



Corpus Compilation and selection criteria

Collection of news articles from two online national Portuguese newspapers :

Diário Notícias: 27 news

=>68 news (49, 485 words) *Público:* 41 news.


