Prof Lynne Bowker

University of Ottawa, Ottawa, Canada

Titre: *La multidimensionnalité dans la terminologie : Vers la découverte de nouveaux concepts ou vers un multivers de la folie ?*

Résumé: Dans la discipline de la terminologie, la multidimensionnalité est un phénomène qui se produit lorsqu'un concept peut être classifié selon deux (ou plusieurs) caractéristiques à la fois. La multidimensionnalité ressemble davantage à la réalité, mais le traitement de ce phénomène est complexe, ce qui explique le peu d'attention manifesté par les premiers terminologues. Depuis les années 1990, les outils informatiques offrent une multitude de possibilités pour intégrer des systèmes de concepts complexes dans les ressources terminologiques. Toutefois, ces systèmes très complexes sont-ils toujours souhaitables ? Ou présentent-ils une surcharge d'informations ? Dans cette conférence, on explorera le passé, le présent et l'avenir de la multidimensionnalité en terminologie.

Biographie: Lynne Bowker est professeure titulaire à l'Université d'Ottawa (Canada) où elle détient une double affectation à l'École de traduction et d'interprétation et l'École des sciences de l'information. En 2020, elle était élue membre de la Société Royale du Canada pour ses contributions au domaine des technologies langagières. Ses activités d'enseignement et de recherche portent sur la terminologie, la lexicographie, la terminotique, la traduction spécialisée et les technologies de la traduction. Elle est (co-) auteur de plusieurs livres, dont Computer-Aided Translation Technology (2002), Working with Specialized Language (2002), Machine Translation and Global Research (2019), et De-mystifying Translation (2023). Elle est membre du comité de rédaction de plusieurs revues spécialisées (p. ex. International Journal of Lexicography, International Journal of Corpus Linguistics), ainsi que traductrice agréée (français-anglais).

Title: *Identification and contextualization of difficult scientific terms*

Abstract: The general public tends to avoid reliable sources such as scientific literature due to their complex language and lacking background knowledge. While traditional methods of text simplification try to eliminate complex concepts, scientific terms are not often replaceable due to the risk of information distortion and these complex concepts should be explained to a reader. In this talk, I will present the overview of the CLEF SimpleText shared task aiming to identify scientific terms that require explanation and to provide this context in order to help a reader to understand the scientific text.

Biography: Liana Ermakova has been an associate professor at the University of Western Brittany (Brest, France) since 2017. Her primary area of research is automatic text simplification, multi-document summarisation, and multilingual wordplay analysis. She is the principal investigator of the SimpleText project: Automatic Simplification of Scientific texts. She has participated in the organization of various conferences and workshops and is a member of the competition division of the French Association for Artificial Intelligence. Dr. Ermakova leads two shared tasks at CLEF which aim at the creation of reusable benchmarks for automatic wordplay analysis (JOKER) and scientific text simplification (SimpleText).
