



CALL FOR THE 1ST ENEOLI TRAINING SCHOOL ON LEXICAL INNOVATION

Who can apply?

The training school is designed for students, PhD candidates, Post-Docs, Early Career Researchers, and Senior Researchers who wish to benefit from the school's innovative and interdisciplinary approach. We welcome participants from diverse backgrounds, particularly those involved in or beginning to engage in projects focused on various aspects of lexical innovation. Each participant will be encouraged to share their perspectives and concerns related to all dimensions of lexical innovation.

Bursaries

Applicants may be eligible for reimbursement to support their participation in the Training School, in accordance with COST Action <u>guidelines</u>. The final reimbursement, of approximately \notin 1200, is intended to cover accommodation and subsistence expenses during the Training School. Additionally, travel costs will also be reimbursed up to \notin 500.

How to apply?

Applications should include the following:

1. A concise CV that includes the date of receipt of your PhD or other advanced degrees. 2. A one-page motivation letter outlining your project or interest in lexical innovation and explaining how attending the Training School would benefit your work.

3. A short presentation (max. 2 pages) of a case study regarding the lexical innovation you are working on.

The deadline for the submission of applications is **February 28th 2025.** The notification of acceptance or rejection will be sent by **March 14th 2025** at the latest.
